
Surviving and Thriving



Youth Programs at UILC

The 2022-2023 school year has started and Utah Independent Living Center's school-based youth programs are in full swing. UILC sends Life Skills Trainers into Middle, High and Post High Schools in Murray, Canyon, Granite, Jordan, Salt Lake, Tooele, Summit and Park City School Districts. The Life Skills Trainers go to classes for one hour each week for a full semester. While they are there, they teach the students about Independent Living. Advocacy, social skills, vocational skills, nutrition and money management are just a few of the topics available to the students. This program has been around since 1985, and over the years thousands of students have benefited from this important program. One of the most requested classes is "Taking care of yourself" in this 12-week class students learn every aspect of hygiene, from handwashing to doing the laundry. Each student enrolled in class receives a hygiene kit full of everything that they will need to prepare for an interview or a community outing. UILC distributes over 200 hygiene kits each year.



The SLC Youth Summer Program just ended for students 16-22 years of age and it started on June 13th. The program was every Monday, Wednesday and Friday for seven weeks until July 31st. Students went on outings into the



community on the bus or Trax. Over the summer students went bowling, visited Nickle mania, Valley Fair Village Housing, Silver Lake and Vocational Rehabilitation Offices.

The students were divided into cooking groups and traveled to an area grocery store to shop for the ingredients to make a nutritious breakfast or lunch. Whole group instruction included bus training, social skills, sex education, self-advocacy and a dance. Over the summer students improved their social skills and overall living skills in a fun and safe environment.
