

Dear Summer Program Applicant and Parent/Guardian,

We are excited to again be offering the Utah Independent Living Center (UILC) Summer Program in its original format for the summer of 2022, for youth with disabilities, in a single 7-week session.

We hope to receive your application soon. We are now enrolling students year-round, so there is no need to delay reserving your students place. Please mail, email, drop-off or fax to the number below. Feel free to call or email me with further questions. We will be accepting 40 students. **We fill up fast and slots will be filled on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE BASIS.**

Participants can attend the Summer Program for a total of 3 years, this can be consecutive or cumulative, but the student must meet the age, student to staff ratio and vaccination requirement.

Summer Program

The UILC Summer Program is for students ages 16-22 with proof of Covid-19 vaccination and who do not require a greater than 7 to 1 student to staff ratio. This program will focus on all aspects of independent living including employment. Students will learn about social skills, dressing for success, and transportation using the bus or Trax to access community resources. Students will also learn how to be an effective self-advocate in an interactive and fun learning environment.

Summer Program dates: The program starts June 13th and then is every day Monday, Wednesday and Friday until July 29th. The Day Camp is Friday July 29th.

Holidays: The Center will be closed are Monday July 4th and Monday July 25th.

Cost for the Program is \$70. This is a donation and no student will be turned away for inability to pay. This donation will assist with the cost of the cooking classes every Friday and the outings. Students will be required to cover the cost of riding the bus to the various activities throughout the summer. The program will also include a bag with hygiene supplies, summer program t-shirt and a DVD.

Safety Measures for Attending Utah Independent Living Center Summer Program 2022

The student's health and safety is the highest priority of the Utah Independent Living Center. We ask that if a student has any of the following symptoms, that the student is kept home until they are symptom free.

Cough

Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

Fever

Chills

Muscle pain

Headache

Sore throat

New loss of taste or smell

Parents/guardians must provide a phone number where they can be reached as well as an alternate emergency contact, in case the student becomes ill or injured while at the Center.

Transportation:

We will be using public transportation for the Summer Program 2022. Students must have a bus pass, cash or FAREPAY card to travel on UTA for outings and shopping trips. Parents are responsible for transporting students to and from summer program each day. UILC is located near public transit making it possible for the students to use the bus and Trax to come and go from UILC. FAREPAY cards are prepaid and reloadable. Cooking:

Each Friday we will learn hands-on cooking skills. All ingredients and expenses for the cooking classes will be covered by UILC. If you student would like to purchase a treat at the store they will be required to bring money/credit card. This is good practice for the students and I encourage parents to consider providing money for small purchases throughout the summer.

Food and Lunches:

Lunches from home will be required Monday, and Wednesday and may be kept in a communal refrigerator.

Lunches will **not** be required on Friday, because of the cooking classes. There may be occasional opportunities to eat at a fast food restaurant. If your student has food allergies or special food requirements make sure to list them on the application.
